

## 2017-2018 Institutional and Endowed Scholarships

Through the generosity of our donors, Prescott College is pleased to offer several scholarships to assist students with their cost of attendance. Scholarship selection criteria will be based on a combination of academic performance, financial need, and/or intended program of study as designated by each donor. Financial need will be determined based on Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) information. We encourage all students to complete the 2017-2018 FAFSA online at [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).

To be considered for any of these scholarships, complete and return the application and essay topics to the Prescott College Financial Aid Office using one of the contact methods below (email a scan, fax, drop of hard copy, or send via post mail) on or **before April 10, 2017 at 5:00 pm**. No exceptions. Due to the large volume of scholarship applications received, we will send notification letters only to those students who are selected as scholarship recipients. Scholarships will be applied to the student's 2017 Fall and/or 2018 Spring semester.

**\*Please note: Being awarded one of the endowed scholarships does not guarantee you will be awarded the amount listed. Many scholarships will be awarded to more than one person and the available funds will be divided among the recipients.**

Julie Bondeson Endowed Scholarship	\$5,400 ea.	Established by Julie Bondeson, to be awarded to any student in good academic standing who demonstrates financial need and is actively pursuing studies in either a sustainable living and/or environmental program. Two awards are available
The Boyce Endowed Scholarship Fund	\$3200	Established by Daniel H. Boyce and Suzanne Boyce to honor the work and mission of their son, Geoffrey Alan Boyce '04 during and after his attendance at Prescott College. This scholarship will be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) with financial need, in recognition of sustained commitment to social and environmental justice and, in particular, innovative work toward tackling issues of regional, community and global justice and sustainability. Any undergraduate student(s) who has declared a competence in this important discipline or who has demonstrated strong interest in these subjects through extracurricular participation is encouraged to apply. When there is more than one particularly outstanding applicant, preference will be given to an On Campus Undergraduate student from a social or racial group that has historically been disempowered and who is a resident of Arizona.
Dugald Bremner Scholarship	\$500	Awarded to a student in any program who is majoring in adventure education or photography.
Gemma Kemp-Garcia Memorial Scholarship	\$600	Established by Margot J. Garcia, first preference is awarded to a student(s) from New Mexico or to a student who is working on a project involving young people from New Mexico. In lieu of such an applicant, the award may be made to any deserving student who presents a compelling need for support and demonstrates commitment to and a passion for education.
Goodman Scholarship Endowment Fund	\$400	Established by Mark and Gwen Goodman, to be awarded to an undergraduate student who demonstrates financial need and has either declared a competence in law or medicine or demonstrates strong interest in the subject through extracurricular participation.
Helen Wright Memorial Scholarship	\$300	Established in memory of Helen R. Wright by the Alta Vista Garden Club of Prescott, Arizona to be awarded to a student(s) in any program who demonstrates academic excellence and is enrolled in studies of plant biology, field biology or other environmental studies that might emphasize conservation of plant species in particular. First preference is given to a graduate of a Prescott, Prescott Valley or Chino Valley high school.
Hulmes Legacy Endowed Scholarship	\$3200	Established by Douglas F. Hulmes '74, to be awarded to an undergraduate student in good academic standing who is actively studying environmental education or to a student who demonstrates an affiliation with the Arizona Wilderness Collaborative Partnership.

<b>Kelly Megan Stack Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$1700	Established by Anna S. Cook, custodian for Madison Stack UGMA, to be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) studying environmental sciences, natural history, or environmental education.
<b>Knaup Family Scholarship Fund</b>	\$1900 ea.	Established by Warren C. and Marianne Knaup, to be awarded equally to one male and one female full-time On Campus Undergraduate student whose FAFSA demonstrates financial need and who is studying and desires a career in the field of environmental conservation and/or environmental education.
<b>Merrill Windsor Memorial Scholarship</b>	\$1600	Established in honor of Prescott College's former trustee and chairman of the Board, Merrill Windsor, by many generous donations from Merrill Windsor's friends and family, to be awarded to a proficient writer or excellent humanities student(s).
<b>Quitobaquito Scholarship</b>	\$2600	Established by an anonymous family to be awarded to a Tohono O'odham Native American student(s) in any program who graduated from a secondary school in the Tohono O'odham Nation of Southern Arizona that demonstrates academic passion and commitment. In lieu of a Tohono O'odham applicant, the award may be made to any Native American student(s) who demonstrates these qualities.
<b>Maas Family Scholarship</b>	\$2200	Awarded to a female Limited Residency Undergraduate student(s) who demonstrates financial need.
<b>Bob &amp; Barbara Mariano Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$1300	Awarded to a student in any program who demonstrates financial need and whose academic work demonstrates excellence and commitment.
<b>William Randolph Hearst Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$6400	Awarded to a Native American student(s) studying teacher education.
<b>Dorothy Ruth Ellis Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$2200	Established by Reuben J. Ellis and Linda L. Dove to honor the memory of Dorothy Ruth Ellis to be awarded to an On Campus Undergraduate student(s) in Writing, Literature, and/or Journalism within the Arts and Letters Program. Any Prescott College student working toward a competence in at least one of these areas or any incoming Prescott College student who declares an intention to work towards a competence in at least one of these areas may apply for the Scholarship. Preference will be given to a student whose legal place of residence is southeast Texas (Jefferson, Orange, Tyler, Newton, and Hardin counties) and/or a student who is a member of an ethnic minority group.
<b>The Arts &amp; Letters Writing and Literature Scholarship</b>	\$3200	This scholarship was established by an anonymous family foundation to recognize outstanding Prescott College On Campus Undergraduate students in Writing and Literature within the Arts & Letters Program. Any Prescott College On Campus Undergraduate students working towards a competence in the realm of Writing and Literature may apply for the award.
<b>KAKATU Foundation Scholarship Fund</b>	\$3300	Established by David Meeks '73 to be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) interested in natural history, environmental education and/or sustainability. Preference will be given to a student who has declared a competence in this important discipline or who has demonstrated strong interest in these subjects through extracurricular participation.

<b>Dr. Bev Santo Scholarship</b>	\$700	Awarded to a Limited Residency Undergraduate student who is a single mother, and whose academic work demonstrates excellence and commitment.
<b>Randy Tufts Memorial Award in Geosciences</b>	\$300	<p>The Randy Tufts Memorial Award in Geosciences was established by Dr. Ericha Schott, widow of Randy Tufts, in partnership with Friends of Kartchner Caverns, to recognize outstanding Prescott College graduate students in the field of Geosciences whose academic and personal interests include exploration, conservation, preservation and the protection of the natural environment. The goal of this award is to encourage and support students who are aligned with the life and mission of Dr. Randy Tufts, co-discoverer of Kartchner Caverns.</p> <p>Any Prescott College student enrolled in the Master of Arts Program with a study emphasis in the broad field of Geosciences may apply for the award. An application will consist of two letters of recommendation addressing the student's commitment to the study of Geosciences, graduate transcripts, and a short personal essay describing the applicant's academic and personal commitments as they relate to the intention of the award.</p>
